# FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



### **VIA TURNS 50!**

In August, 2022, Via celebrated 50 years of serving seniors in the Mobile community. Our 50th anniversary bash was a joyous event, as we were finally able to gather in person after the isolation from Covid. With music from the Tip Tops, our guests danced the night away. A special thanks to all of our sponsors and members who were able to join us.

Via, which began as Senior Citizens Services, was one of the first five senior centers funded in Alabama through the Older Americans Act. Today, Via houses a 42,000 square foot community Senior Center and offers health, fitness and enrichment programs onsite to 1,500 older adults and provides services to thousands of community users each year. We were proud to celebrate this work this year and look forward to 50 more years of serving seniors in our community.

### PROGRESS ON OUR BUILDING AND IN THE COMMUNITY

Upkeep of a 42,000 square foot building is not for the faint of heart! Every year we work on building maintenance and upgrades, and last year was no exception. Thanks to funding from ADECA, we installed \$27,000 in lighting upgrades. We retiled the serving line flooring in the café, installed a new oven in the kitchen, and purchased a new sign for our Dauphin Street Café. We completed a new laundry room to better serve our rentals and on-site events, and we installed a new HVAC unit in our billiards room. Our bingo players donated \$3,451 towards the purchase of a new bingo board. Lastly, we spent \$25,000 resealing and striping our parking lot, which we hope makes it easier for all of our members and guests to access our center.

In 2022, Via also continued to meet the needs of vulnerable seniors throughout Mobile County. Thanks to discretionary funding from Councilman William Carroll, funding from AARP Mobile and UWSWA, along with donations from Thrivent - we provided monthly food distributions to seniors and their families in need. Funding from Mobile County Commission and the AHEPA Foundation allowed us to provide Portable Diagnostic Wellness services, food distributions and Covid/cleaning supplies for seniors at the AHEPA senior centers throughout Mobile County.

As part of our efforts to keep our members more informed, Via also updated our website. We designed the new website with our members and other seniors in mind, we think you will find it very user friendly. You can find information about membership, monthly fitness and recreation calendars, café menus, upcoming events, rentals, and information about our community needs outreach division. 
# **WHAT'S COMING IN 2023**


To the left you can view the full breakdown of Via Center income for the 2021-2022 fiscal year. A special thanks to all of our donors, members, and volunteers who make this work possible.




