FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR





As I look back on this year, I am overwhelmed with gratitude. This year our membership surpassed 1,800, an astounding number considering our recent forced closure due to Covid. We have nine new community partners, and we had our most successful fundraising event to date, raising more than \$82,000. We now have a staff of 23 allowing us to better meet the needs of our members and the community that surrounds us.

Other exciting programs began this year as well. Thanks to a grant from the National Council on Aging, we were able to start a monthly clinic to provide vaccinations for flu and Covid-19 to our members onsite. Our GrandFriends Adult Day Program was approved as an accredited provider for veterans in the VA healthcare system, meaning veterans in our area can take advantage of the program at no cost through their VA benefits. Our monthly food program is growing - we are now providing 130 families with food each month. With additional funding from Mobile County, we were also able to deliver food and cleaning supplies to more than 300 seniors at AHEPA income-based housing centers throughout Mobile County.

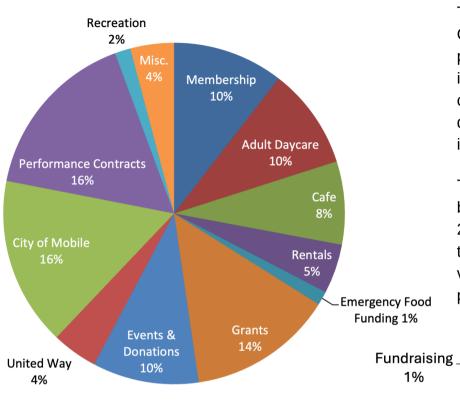
Our newest monthly fundraiser, "Bingo Night" was a success, raising just over \$12,000. With a successful annual campaign and fundraising event, we were able to update flooring outside the fitness room, in the fitness hallway, locker rooms, and in the billiards room. A generous donation allowed us to completely renovate the fitness room, and new fitness equipment and chairs were also purchased.

Managing a 42,000 square foot building means constant change, and this coming year is no exception. Thanks to a generous grant from ADECA, all the old lighting will be replaced with new low-energy LED lighting. The same grant will allow us to replace two aging HVAC systems in the gym. We will continue to upgrade flooring throughout the center. Look for these and other upgrades throughout the new year!

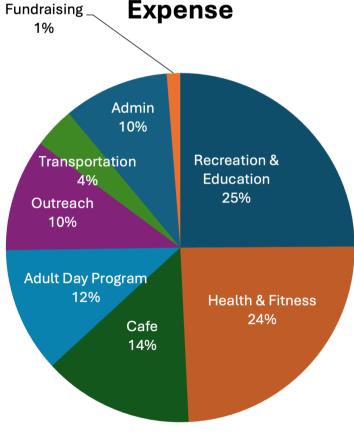
Income
